### **Partners**

Partnerships are a big part of HAA's mission. The more allies we have, the more of a difference we can make. Together we achieve -- literally -- the impossible.

The HPOs assist police officers and State Troopers; work with shelters and rescues on large-scale cases, partner with veterinarians on medical situations. Armstrong County District Attorney Katie Charlton's office also supports the program.

The officers also partner with community service organizations to improve living conditions for those struggling to care for their animals.
